



## CCS Golden Warriors Basketball

### Goals/Objectives

1. To develop Christ-like character in the lives of the players through personal and social interaction
2. To encourage good health hygiene/physical exercise through involvement in the program
3. To encourage excellence in academic performance
4. To develop positive role-modeling, team play, and unity between students and coaches

### Eligibility

1. A student must maintain a “C” average. When the sports season begins, five-week evaluations and quarterly averages will be tallied by the classroom teachers to determine eligibility. When deemed necessary, average weekly grades will also be considered. Students receiving an “F” for the quarter are automatically disqualified. Classroom teachers will inform the coaches concerning ineligibility of any students.
2. The coaches may disqualify students from participation due to the following reasons:
  - Lack of cooperation
  - Lack of participation (includes missing scheduled games/practices)
  - Argumentativeness/back talk
  - Bad/Inappropriate language
  - Fighting/disruptive behavior
  - Sowing discord/disunity between students

A student involved in any of the above offenses will be suspended from a week’s practices or games. If the student is corrected for the same offense again, they will be suspended for two weeks with an increase of one week each time the behavior occurs. In the event that the offense is considered serious, the coach or advisor shall notify the parents for a conference and determination made in conjunction with the parents as to future consequences or participation.

3. Students on academic or behavioral probation or students receiving a suspension will not be permitted to participate.
4. Students receiving 10 PCS’s in a quarter shall forfeit their privilege to participate at the time of their 10<sup>th</sup> PCS.
5. ADORE students may participate as long as the classroom teacher, ADORE therapist, parents, and coach are in agreement concerning the student’s consistent and positive academic and social aptitude and performance.

### Guidelines

1. Uniforms will be provided by CCS. Students will be responsible for keeping the uniforms clean and in good repair during use and when returned at the end of the season. Uniforms are to be worn only during practices, games or competition events. They may not be worn to school during school hours (spirit rallies excepted). The uniforms are considered a part of athletic attire and are limited to athletic events.
2. A sports fee of \$40 for CCS students, \$50 for non-CCS students will be assessed each school year and is due on the first practice.
3. A parent/guardian permission form must be turned in by the first practice.

4. Practices will be held several times during the week after school and as needed as game time gets closer.
5. Students are asked to stay together at all games and not run around. They are not to get into any car except that of a CCS parent or the school coach.
6. Students are required to maintain Christ-like conduct at all times.
7. Discipline among the team will follow the same guidelines as those set forth for classroom teachers.
8. Parents are responsible to make arrangements to get their player to practice and the games.
9. A sports physical is required as set out in the Illinois State Requirements as follows:
  - A sports physical is needed if participating in school sports for all grades except for 6 (regular school physical will serve as sports physical)

## Eligibility and Guidelines for Extra-Curricular Activities

Eligibility for all offices and extra-curricular activities is the same, except for Student Leadership Council. A student must maintain at least a C average in core subjects, and not be on probation. Students on a suspension are also ineligible for the duration of the suspension.

Students who are in leadership positions receiving 10 or more PCS's in the previous semester will be ineligible for class officership. Students who have 10 PCS's in a semester shall relinquish their leadership position at the time of the 10th PCS.

An agreement form consenting to participation and payment of non-refundable fees must be signed prior to the initial date of the activity. Students selected to participate in ACSI activities who choose to withdraw from the activity without a valid reason as determined by the sponsor, shall reimburse the school for the prepaid activity registration fee. Parents volunteering for ACSI events shall not receive financial reimbursements and shall adhere to the school and event dress codes.

Parents attending extra-curricular events shall abide by the same standards expected from students toward coaches, advisors, chairpersons, staff, students, etc.:

- Only kind/appropriate language
- No argumentativeness, back talk, or loud/rude speech
- No fighting/disruptive behavior
- No sowing discord/disunity
- Cooperation/Respect/Christ-like conduct

The Matthew 18 Principle must be used at all times (see page 18). Failure to abide by any of the above standards may result in indefinite school withdrawal of the student from the activity and/or prohibition of parental attendance of the activity as determined by the administration/coaches/advisors/staff.

ADORE and resource students may participate as long as the classroom teacher, ADORE and resource therapists, parents, and coach are in agreement concerning the student's consistent and positive academic and social aptitude and performance.

At the end of the activity, parents are asked to be punctual in picking up their students. An extended care fee of \$1.00 a minute will be charged for care which coaches/advisors must give. Students are asked to stay with the coaches/advisors at all basketball games. No running around, visiting family and friends is allowed, and students must ask permission to go anywhere. At the end of the activity, parents must supervise their students by staying with them until they leave the premises.

Commitment is important for CCS students. Students who decide to forfeit their involvement in extra-curricular activities (Band, Safety Patrol, Student Leadership Council, etc.) must have a valid, written parental excuse accepted by the coach/advisor and administration).

If a student is an extra-curricular activity, any of his/her siblings or car-pooling students that are waiting will be placed in Extended Care (at the regular fee).
